## **Dr. Ashok Asundi:**

Retired Professor and Chairman of the Department of Library and Information Science, and Officer in charge of IT Centre at Bangalore University, Bangalore. Worked before that in the Libraries of Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore, K.R.Engineering College (Now NITK), Surathkal and J.N.Medical College, Belgaum. After his Graduation with Chemistry and Physics worked as Chemist and Furnace in charge at Electro-Metallurgical Works, Dandeli for 2 and 1/2 years.

As a professor: Teaching, Research and Administration. Curriculum development, Evaluation. Taught MLISc Programmes and Guide/Supervisor for M.Phil and Ph.D. Associated with more than 40 Universities in India as Member of BOS, BOA, and BOE. Resource Person for Continuing Education Programmes and also for National and International Conferences - Organiser, Rappoteur, Director and Chairman of Technical Sessions.

### **Professor and Chairman, Officer in charge IT Centre**

August 1985 - June 2002 16 years 11 months

First appointed as Reader in the Department of Library and Information Science, elevated to the post of Professor (1994) and at the time of Superannuation I was Chairman of the Department (2000) and after Superannuation appointed as first Officer in charge of IT Centre, Bangalore University, Bangalore to set up the IT Centre and also to provide computer literacy training to all the PG Students in the University and also to teach a paper in Computer Applications - Biotechnology, Kannada, Physics and Political Science departments. . Also served as member of the Academic Council for 10 years.

After his retirement I was invited by the SIT to reorganise the Technical Library. Automated the same and established Language Learning Laboratory with 30 Computers and Software. He was also involved in TEQIP evaluation team to audit the equipment inventory purchased under the World Bank Project. Organised two Scientific Meeting, 1) Professional Communication 2) Library Automation and Networking. He was also Visiting Professor at P.G Department of Management Studies, of SIT and taught MIS and Information Systems for MBA for four years.

**Prof. H.S. Lakshminarayana Bhatta,**

**Popularly known as 'Kaggada Bhatta' received the coveted DGV Mukataka Sahitya Award.**

Born in 1946, Prof. Bhatta is a M.Sc. Degree holder in Physics, a 'Visharada' from All India Hindi Prachara Sabha, an 'Uttama' from All India Bhagawad Geetha Study Centre, Gorakhpur. He has served as Professor of Physics in Visweshwarapuram Science College, Bangalore and also as Principal of the same college.

He has given a number of discourses and lectures on DVG's Mankutimmana Kagga and other Mukataka literatures in and outside the State. He has aired a number of programmes on Kagga on Doordarshan and Akashvani and has participated in online programmes with listeners.

Prof. Bhatta has to his credit a number of books on Kannada Literature including his Ghamaghamisuva Vanasuma, DVG - Timmaguruvina Darshana (Gundopanishat).

He has received a number of awards and titles for his work in this field.

He has written a book: Thimmaguruvina Darshana. It is an analytical study of the 945 verses of Kagga. Its unique feature is that the author has revived the context-based divisions of the verses as adopted in the very early editions of the "Mankutimmana Kagga", adding a distinctiveness to the divisions through his vast experience and deep-rooted study of the work.
